\*\*\* You're in for a treat when you visit a professional graphics store. This book (and my other books) are based on using a vector graphics program called Illustrator, but Photoshop has much more powerful tools than Illustrator. If you're running a studio that specializes in graphic design, illustrations, and so forth, Photoshop is highly recommended. \*\*\* Photoshop's interface is much simpler than Illustrator. Everything you do is organized into layers that you can adjust from different areas of an image. (Layers work much like the stack in Photoshop Book I, Chapter 5.) The following sections explain the basics of using layers to manipulate, edit, and combine images. Using layers for editing Making changes to an image is easy to do in Photoshop. You simply create a new layer — you can add it if you have a blank layer or move and drag existing layers, as explained in the next section, "Using Layers." In Photoshop, you can rearrange all the layers in a document on the same layer stack. If you need a fresh set of layers to work on, you can create a new document and create a new stack. See Chapter 9 for more information about layer stacks. Figure 13-1 is a layer that's been dragged all the way to the right and down. You see that each layer is, in turn, selected, which means that each is individually accessible in the Layers palette. (See Book III, Chapter 6 for more information about the Layers palette.) If you want to add a layer to an existing image, select it first, and then press Ctrl+J (+J on the Mac) to add it to the existing layer. To start working on a new layer that's not part of any existing layer, simply click the New Layer icon at the bottom of the Layers palette (it's the square with the arrow in the middle of the palette). Photoshop creates the new layer and gives it a name, depending on your preference. You can name the new layer anything that makes sense to you; no names are necessary. If you are a web developer or graphic designer, it is important to have a Photoshop alternative that allows you to work on images instead of web design projects. If you often edit images on the job, you can use Photoshop Elements to create new images for your clients or yourself. If you are looking to get a photo editing app, it is good to know that there are many alternatives to Photoshop with some of them specifically created to be used on the iPad, Android, Mac, and Windows platforms. If you don't have any experience with graphic design or photo editing, there are Photoshop tutorials and guides for beginners that will help you get up to speed. If you use MacBook or MacBook Air, you can use the Lightroom app to edit and edit photos. The software program is available for the Mac and runs on Windows, iOS, and Android. An alternative to Photoshop is available for the iPad (Photo Editor Pro), iPhone (Photo Editor Free), and Mac (iPhoto), so you can edit photos on the go. You can download the free trial version or make a full-featured purchase of the paid version. Corel PaintShop Pro X8 Corel PaintShop Pro X8 is a photo editing software for Mac and Windows that allows you to edit images, create a virtual machine, create a slideshow, and more. The tool can work with RAW images and with a variety of graphics, including Adobe Photoshop, but it does not offer as many features as Photoshop. Corel PaintShop Pro X8 is one of the more affordable photo editing tools. It will allow you to edit several RAW files at the same time and has a collection of basic image editing tools, including a clone tool, a brush tool, a healing brush tool, and more. If you are looking for an affordable alternative to Photoshop, this is one of the best graphic editor apps for the Mac and Windows. Most tutorials are based on the Mac version of PaintShop Pro. You will also find some beginner tutorial on the PaintShop Pro X8 but, if you are looking for an app that can compete with Adobe Photoshop, you should consider a program that is designed for photo editing and offers more features than PaintShop Pro X8. According to the FCC, who will be handing the reins over to Republican-elected Trump administration, the Commission's inaction plan for the IoT includes removing its Connect America Fund broadband investment program. However, it will continue to have a cybersecurity task force -- a group that is continuing to consider the cybersecurity needs of the IoT, including privacy. "In 2015, the Commission adopted rules to permit broadband providers to connect their customers to the Internet-connected devices, provided that they could demonstrate technical feasibility, good character, and other requirements," the agency wrote in a statement. "As a result of its order, now seven years ago, the Commission will start a review to consider whether to repeal the 'Connect America Fund,' or to adjust it so that it effectively permits broadband providers to connect their customers to the Internet of Things." The FCC's action plan is part of "an effort to remove government's unneeded or inconsistent encumbrances on broadband growth," the FCC writes. The FCC could not confirm a timeline for the study, because of all the politics that played out between the Republican-led Congress and the Obama administration.
